JESSICA HERBERT

was thereupon called as a witness to testify on behalf of the Plaintiff and having been first duly sworn by the Notary to tell the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth, was examined and testified as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. WERDELL:

- Jessica, as you know my name is Lee Werdell, I represent a lady named Noreen Renier, who is the Plaintiff in a case against John Merrell. On the telephone with us today is This will be a Roxie Cuellar who represents Mr. Merrell. deposition regarding your knowledge about certain facts involved in that case. Roxie and I have agreed that with taking this deposition over the telephone and on a tape recorder, we will use it in lieu of a deposition back where you are in Massachusetts or in lieu of having you come out Would you raise your right hand? here to testify in Oregon. Do you solemnly swear that testimony you are about to give in the cause now pending will be the truth and nothing but the truth?
- A I do.
- Q For the record would you state your full name and your occupation?
- A Jessica Herbert. Occupation is broker for Carlson Real

- Do you live in Massachusetts?
- Α Yes, 95 (inaudible).
- All right. Do you know a person named Noreen Renier?
- 5 Yes, I do.
 - Did you have a brother who was involved unfortunately in an airplane crash sometime back?
- 8 Α Yes.

- 9 Q About how long ago was that?
- 10 Α Approximately 2½ years ago.
- Could you tell us what your brother's name was? 11 Q
- Α 12 Arthur Joseph Herbert.
 - All right, how did you happen to become acquainted with Noreen Renier?
 - I...at the time of my brother's involvement with the plane crash...a...we'd been working with the civil air patrol and the air force searching for the whereabouts of the plane in January of 1984. January and February I should say. After approximately 10 days of extensive searching the air force made a decision to cease any further operations mainly for monetary reasons as they have fixed budgets....and I spoke with a Captain in Illinois who was in charge of this particular case, and asked him what I might do to get them to continue the search and he said they would need much more information and I said what type of information and he said well, basically, more specific....the location of the plane.

They need to know the exact location and he said basically yes...(inaudible)...so, after talking with the Civil Air Patrol people and other people I decided that I needed to look at some other measures and I had never used psychics or that sort of thing before, but just over the years of reading different police cases and so forth, sometimes they had been referred to as being somewhat successful or at least useful. So at this point I called the police departand in San Francisco to get some informent in Los Ang mation on how successful they had been in different cases such as the Charles Manson case, etc., they basically didn't give me much information. They weren't too supportive of the idea of using psychics basically. They didn't want to say so over the phone anyway. So then I called the Atlanta P.D. who was in charge of the Wayne Williams case and asked It had been written up in the papers how he felt about it. that they were fairly successful using a psychic and his response was that he felt they were very useful but they were organized people who come into a chaotic situation and put +ogether facts, crea+e some order out of disorder, therefore very useful to police departments and so forth. didn't really believe in psychic powers per se or at least he wasn't willing to say he did, but he did feel that it would be worth a shot. So I asked him for some names and he gave me a few and I talked to other people about it and one of the names that was suggested was Noreen Renier and she was

recommended by an F.B.I. agent who had taken a course that she had given at Quantico on E.S.P. and thought she was very impressive and as far as he knew reputable person, she had been doing this course for a number of years there, had worked with police departments and so forth and of all of those that I had mentioned she sounded like maybe my best bet and also location wise she was in Charleston, Virginia at that time.

- Q Could I ask you whether or not at that time were you married to a person connected with the F.B.I.?
- A Yes, Mark Babyak.
- Q All right...did you contact Noreen Renier then?
- A Yes, I did.
- Q And would you tell us about what you did to contact her and what happened?
- A Well, basically she asked me to bring some items that belonged to my brother and come out to Charlottesville,
 which I did and he had, I don't know what you'd call it,
 a session or whatever, where she took the items and I gave
 her a little information basically that my brother had been
 missing for over 10 days at that point and we believed that
 he was involved in a place crash, at that time we didn't
 know for sure that he had been because they had not filed
 a flight plan. There was no conclusive evidence that he was
 aboard the plane. (Inaudible)...but since he wasn't any
 place else we assumed he was and so I said that we felt the

A

plane had gone down somewhere in Massachuttes or New Hampshire. We didn't know where or if it had gone down in the ocean. Basically only that information. I also told her that my brother was pretty healthy, an athletic person, played professional hockey and I felt that if anyone could survive this kind of thing, he probably could but you know time was of the essence so she and I sat down and she did her thing. Essentially started free wheeling information about things that came into her head as she got involved, I guess trying to figure out where he was, and what had happened and so forth. And I think just to summarize it, basically she felt very interesting information such as....

- Q Yes, go ahead tell us what that is. .
 - Okay. She first described my brother. She had no information there, nothing written in the papers about the crash, up here anyway and even in...I should say Washington...and there had been something in the newspaper in Massachuttes but they had thought my mother was involved in the plane crash because the car registration was in her name at the airport and there had been absolutely no information anywhere about my brother, no description of any kind, so she proceeded to describe him that he's not quite 6 feet tall, he's 5'113/4", she could have guessed that he had a good build, but she pointed out that he had some sort of a space in his front teeth, then she said 'no, I'm wrong, there's something happened to that space', she said, 'It's very

strange, I see a space but I see no (inaudible);. Well, in fact he had quite a space in his front teeth, and he had just lone year before that got braces and the space just at that point, did close within the last few months. (Inaudible) So, I thought that was fairly interesting and she also...she mentioned to me that she thought he must be very nervous because she noticed that his nails had been bitten down....well, he had never bit his nails by himself, but had become one because of circumstances he was involved in. That was something she couldn't obviously known. details about him physically. Then she proceeded to describe the four people in the plane which I had gotten more information about the woman and then two other men besides my brotherand a described them incredibly accurately. She would have no way of knowing. Also as to the (inaudible) she described the area as being almost primitive with gorges, quicksand and all this. Well, that in fact, I didn't even know. That is the western part of Massachuttes and it is like that, but I had no knowledge of that and I lived all my life in Massachuttes except for 5 years in D.C., which I thought was pretty interesting.

- Q Five years where?
- A In Washington.
- Q Okay.
- A And she said that in that area where the crash occurred that there was an old woman...lived in a house but it had been a

had a Texaco sign, rusting out in front of it. She described a lot of stone fence, foundation, mentioned old woman in that area but she couldn't really see her, it's there now, but she had been there for many years and she mentioned dogs.

Dogs barking everywhere in the area, at...I'll come back to that. She also described where the plane went down...

a...it was at a junction of 3 letters and she gave me those letters and she didn't know exactly what they meant.

- Q The letters?
- Yes, letters. She said, 'I see a junction and I see three letters'. Well, as it turned out those letters were the first letters of three towns and where the plane went down and as a matter of fact, it took the authorities a couple of days to determine whether it went down in Templeton, Gardner or...I forgot the name of the third town, but she had given me the letters of the three towns. It had gone down right at that point.
- Q Let me ask you a couple of questions about that. Did she know what the letters meant?
- A She didn't at the time, she said they could be letters of streets, they could be towns, they could be...she said I don't know, but they will be significant. One of the things she said, 'the information I've given you could be all just visions, you'll have to take it, it will all be there in the end, but you'll have to figure out how to put it together.

- When you say a junction of letters, I don't know if she used the work junction, how did that seem to you to be meant when you received that information, was it somewhere in between these three towns or...?
- A Well, it was right....
- Q A highway junction or what?
- Well, it was right where the plane was down, it was right where the actual town lines crossed and so it was out in the woods, but Templeton and Gardner and I forget the name of the third town, but the three of them where they meet, where the town lines are together, at that point.
- Q All right. I'm afraid that leads me to another question.

 I gather from what you say that in Massachuttes the boundries of the towns extend a long way out of town?
- A Right.
- Q Okay, that's somewhat different here in the west in Oregon.

 That helps me.
- A So each town would have a center of a town, but there would be outskirts, an area where they all met, it would have to be a very rocky terrain. The plane crashed approximately half a mile off the runway of the Gardner airport.
- Q All right. Besides the information which contained the letters that were the first letter of the three towns, and

the idea that they were somehow all connected or there was a junction that was important to those three letters....

- I'd have to go over my notes....she may have even said that she thought they were letters of a town or towns.
- Okay. Let's leave that for now and I'll ask you whether or not she gave any more information about location. Things she described so far, a rather unusual residence of an old woman, that had been a gas station or general store, and the information about letters and town names. Did she give you any other information about where you might find the plane?
 - She, you know, Well, she had given me a lot of numers. said some of them could be numbers of major highways, or small backroads, whatever and so I jotted all those down. Some of them she had feelings were major highways and others she thought might be smaller roads and then she had three other numbers that I've forgotten exactly what they are...20. 24, 68, something like that, and she kept repeating them, and she said 'I don't know what these mean but they definitely have something to do with the location. It turned out when I got to Gardner and gave that information to the Colonel in charge of the Civil Air Patrol, we were putting everything together to see how this all related to those towns longitude and latitude, so we put those down, we were using a map to pinpoint areas, and then she said something else about it being a...hundred seventy-five or...

whatever the mileage is from Gardner to New York City, she said that...she kinda rambled and she said, 'It'll be 175 miles...

- O I'm sorry I didn't catch that last....It'll be?
- A One Hundred and Seventy-Five miles from the big city and after we measured it out on the map and first we were going into it backwards, taking all of her information and trying to pinpoint this area. Then I hired a pilot from the Agency and chartered a plane and we flew to...
- Let me interupt you for a moment...with the information about 175 miles from the big city...did you make any judg-ment about what city that would be?
- A Well, we were trying to decide...we knew it couldn't be Boston, if it were in fact Gardner as everything pointed to Gardner. She took a map and with her finger put it on Gardner area...
- Q Who did?
- A When...
- Q Noreen?
- A Yes. So we were using Gardner as the hub of where we were looking and a...measured out from there, and it turned out that the longitude and latitude were correct for Gardner.

 Numbers she had given me and all the different route numbers like 93 and some of the other ones all went through this area so all these clues that she had given me...the last thing she did was take the map and put her finger on the

area and she basically went through this free wheeling 1 session first...so anyway we tried to put all this together 2 and then included the flight plan she'd given me. 3 Jessica, I'm sorry but I'm going to have to ask you if you 4 ever came to any conclusion about what the large city was? 5 New York. Oh yes. Α 6 Q Okay. 7 Because that was the only large city from Gardner that Α 8 happened to be the exact miles she gave me. 9 Now, one last question about that. Do you recall today Q 10 whether it was 175 or are you using that as...? 11 I'm just using that. I don't remember but whatever number Α 12 she gave me was the exact as the crow flies miles from 13 Gardner to New York City. 14 I think you were going to tell us about a plane. All right. Q 15 Did you charter a plane? 16 Yes I did. Α 17 Who flew it? Q 18 An F.B.I. agent who was a friend of my husbands. Α 19 All right. What happened then when you chartered the plane? Q 20 Well we...it was a very stormy day, we had some difficulty Α 21 trying to fly low, in low areas, but anyway she had given 22 me some locations in the hills and a description of area on 23 the ground and water being near it and she said that she felt 24 it was very very close to the airport, so we were ... and she 25 also described how the plane had taken off, how it had been 26

flying over the airport and had accelerated and made a sharp left and a right, so that's what we did, we took off, made a sharp left, a sharp right and she'd given us a certain number of seconds before the crash, so we were trying ... you know, basically to replay this crashing, getting to this area she was talking about, and as we did this several times did come to this hill area and there was water near by and many of the things she described were And so we kept flying over this area, the weather got worse and we had to come in. So, I left all this information with the Civil Air Patrol people, and headed back to Washington (inaudible). The next morning the Civil Air Patrol was back out with better light and they found the The one other piece of information was at the same time we were flying, my husband's cousins were in a car sitting from where we were, trying to drive to that area, and they got to more or less a dead end street which abutted a forest area. They couldn't go any further and they tried to get out of the car and when they did, there were all these dogs coming from almost nowhere, barking and so forth and they couldn't get out of the car. That related back to, as I was putting all the pieces together again, after...that related back to what she said about the dogs barking, that would be in this area.

- Q Had she told you that there would be...?
- A She had told me that in conjuction with this woman, old

- Did the ... Q
 - That existed also in the area, that's what the Colonel of the Civil Air Patrol...why he got very interested in putting some of the other clues together because he didn't A couple of State Troopers came know about the old woman. to the airport at the time and were interested in what was going on and so forth and mentioned (inaudible).
- You're going to have to speak up a little. Q
 - The Colonel of the Civil Air Patrol was talking to a couple of State Troopers and explaining that a psychic had given some information that might the helpful to the case and they were very skeptical and so forth and then he divulged some of the information including the old woman, the cabin, the gas pumps and so forth and all of a sudden their whole attitude changed because there was in fact an old woman who had this cabin with a dry goods store-gas station type of thing and there was a rusting, old type of sign hanging outside. She had died about a year previously, which went back to what Noreen had said about this old woman being there, but she wasn't. And so...
- Let me ask you this question. Was the plane found where Q she had described it?
- Yes. Α
- Was it...how precise was it in terms of being where she had Q described it?

Well, it was in an area exactly the way she had described it...there being, you know, very thickly forested, very primitive. She said very rocky and there was quicksand around the area, big gorges, in fact this hill that they actually crashed into ...the tree...she mentioned also that there was a down draft that had sucked the plane down, she could feel the ...well, in fact, this down draft caused by that hill being there, the way the air current flowed off the runway and a...they were flying too low at that point and that's what she had said, that it was flying too low and it had caught in a down draft. That's exactly what happened. And she also described the injuries that people had....

- Q I was going to ask you about that. Did she say anything about your brother's injury?
 - Yes. She said that he had a broken leg and she said that he had survived the crash and he'd tried to help the girl and that the pilot and the other fellow had been killed by severe head injuries and so forth, severe trauma, that she had severe trauma to the head, her face and her eyes were bleeding (inaudible) in fact she had ended up being decapitated. She said that my brother had tried to help her out of the plane and he was going to go for help, well the two people, the pilot and the other fellow in front of the plane were crushed to death, head injuries as she said. The woman was lying between two trees, and as though she

had been placed there. This is exactly what some of the fellows who were first in (inaudible) told us directly .. (inaudible) we had trouble getting information...state troopers don't like to tell too much about it. Anyway he said it looked as though she had been placed there and I asked about my brother. You know I was trying to find out how much was true and he says, 'Well he and his daughter had gone in on snowmobiles and were the first persons to get there'. And he said, 'Well, we!..his daughter said, 'We tripped over your brother' and he said, 'the first thing my daughter said was, 'this fellow walked here, he lived'. and I said what made her say that? And he said, 'well just above him was a branch of a tree sticking out and a piece of sweatshirt was torn and hanging from the tree, and the way he was sitting, his sitting position on the side of the hill, he couldn't have been thrown from the plane and landed in that position'. It appeared that he had walked there and had sat down at that point. Well she said the....she told me that he had left the plane and set the girl in a hard place with trees above ther and she was laying on the rocks underneath the trees...and that as he went down this hill to look for help that he had to sit down because the pain in his leg was so bad, sitting down going down hill, well in fact he was sitting down, going down hill, and he had a broken leg. He also had a severe head injury which they determined was

the cause of death, well it wasn't clear whether or not that was caused by the accident or what, I was told later that animals had gotten near him...but none of it was clear exactly.

- Q What had Noreen Renier told you about those things you described that turned out to be the case regarding, I believe you said she indicated there was a broken leg?

 Did she say anything about your brother leaving the plane?
- A She said all that. Noreen said that he had survived, the girl had survived....and that he had taken her out of the plane, set her in a safe place and gone for help. Also described how he had tried to get down the side of the big hill and sat down because of the broken leg.
- All right. Would you...have you ever received any inquiries or has your former husband Mark Babyak as far as you know, ever received any inquiries from the defendant in this case John Merrell?
- A No.
- Q Had you received an inquiry from Mr. Merrell or any other person, if you had received an inquiry from Mr. Merrell or any other person would you have been willing to disclose these facts to them?
- A Certainly. I mean I don't have any reason why not to.
- Q All right. I believe you had indicated you have never had anything to do with a psychic prior to contacting Noreen Renier, is that correct?

- No. I never had. Α
- All right. I think that's all the questions I have. Now it's going to be Roxie Cuellar's turn and before we start, Roxie, I'm about to get to the end of this tape again, so I'd better put a new one in.

CROSS EXAMINATION

BY MS. CUELLAR:

- Q Ms. Herbert?
- Α Yes?
- The newest article that I just have a few questions. Q appeared is the Ashland Tidings on May 4, 1985 and in it it described the condition (inaudible)...in regards to a downed airplane. The ariticle says that she used (inaudible) to locate a lost aircraft in Virginia. Now the plane crash you described occurred in Massachuttes, is that correct?
- Yes. Α
- Okay. Could you tell me...you indicated that there was Q no flight plan that was filed...did the authorities know what airport left from?
- Yes, they did. Α
- Okay, so they left from the Gardner airport? Q
- It left actually from Mansfield...the south shore. Α
- Okay, where is Mansfield in relationship to Gardner? Q
- Mansfield is on the south shore about 30 miles south Α

of Boston...Gardner is the western part of the state about oh...oh about a 3 hour drive from Boston, so maybe 180 miles or so.

- Q Okay, so about 100...the plane was found about 180 miles from where it took off?
- A ...well yeah, I guess so because they flew toward Boston and went left or west to Gardner, so it could have actually been more miles than that.
- Q Was there ever any indication (inaudible) that the plane landed in Gardner and took off from there?
- A No.
- Q It never did land in Gardner?
- A No.
- So when Renier, Noreen Renier described the fact that it went left and then it turned sharply to the right and then seconds later went down (inaudible) ... is that correct?
- A It did (inaudible)...as far as we know. I mean...she was describing how to get to where it was. She was, quote in the plane...you know she was putting herself in that position. Saying, I'm in the plane now...I'm over the airport..and now we're going to accelerate..and all of a sudden, I don't know why we're doing this, but we're making a sharp left and a sharp right and then....
- Q (Inaudlble)
- MR. WERDELL: I request that she be allowed to finish.
- Q Well, I'm a little confused and I just want to clarify

whether I'm confused or what...When you say that it did happen are you saying that's what your brother's plane did or are you saying that this is what Noreen used as a way to identify the location?

- This is the way Noreen described...what the plane did in A terms ofwhat she thought happened...and I said how do we get to where the plane is. I need to know specifically where it is....and she was putting herself in the ... supposedly in the plane...and it was described I mean the authorities were going backhover and there are official reports that we had thatyou know they try to go back and figure out how the crash occurred and basically one of the conclusions was that they accelerated at too low an altitude and they came upon this hill and there was a down draft at that point that pulled them down, they didn't have enough (inaudible) at that point to make it up over the top of the hill with the trees and therefore crashed into one of the tall trees.
 - Okay. So when you said that you followed the flight plan Q and you made the sharp right and left...you were taking off from the Mansfield airport....
 - I chartered a plane in Washington and No...from Gardner. Α flew to Gardner. We were following the same plight plans that supposedly my brother's plane had flown.
 - Okay then I'm still confused. Are you saying now that Q he did take off from Gardner airport or he did not?

No...let me just explain it. He left from the Mansfield airport on the south shore. There was no flight plan filed and it was believed that they were going to New Hampshire to visit friends. My brother's birthday was two days away. There was no reason for them to be in the Gardner area, so no one was looking and where we thought they might be was there was a meteor shower that night and several people had reported what they thought they saw was a plane going down, so they were actually looking at Beverely which is on north shore...we thought the plane might have gone down So everybody was looking north of Boston and in the ocean. then they thought possibly that west of Boston someone had reported they thought they heard a crash of a plane in that area, but they also thought it could have been a car crashing too and so after 10 days there was ...you.know... the authorities thought they would try to track down every possibility and it wasn't until later that this report of a crash.... they never landed in Gardner, they were flying over. were having engine trouble I think. The reason they went west was because they were going to go to the Gardner air= port for help but the airport was closed and there were no lights there and they couldn't just land. So they never landed there. And a...another thing that happened was she described as she was saying.....

Ms. Herbert? A...I have quite a few questions (inaudible)
I have a few, maybe I could ask those first..maybe some of

them will pertain to what you're about to tell me.

- Q Do you remember what town they were located in?
- A Oh, it was all Gardner.
- Now were you... about when before you met with Ms. Renier was it the Civil Air Patrol in Gardner that was working on the case there?
- A Yes.

- Q If (inaudible) Gardner, if nobody thought at that point that there was a reason to look for them in Gardner....
- Well as I said they hadthere had been a report of a crash near the airport....a loud noise that neighbors had called the police the night of it which had been like 10 days before this time...that I was speaking with Noreen and they had determined it must have been a car crash because they had sent people out looking and they didn't find anything so they had assumed it must have been a car crash.
- Did you tell Noreen about that reported crash near the airport?
- A Yes. And I also explained that they had started looking in that area also.
- Q Okay. When had they started looking in that area? Like the day before you contacted Noreen?
- A Yes.
- Q Had they stopped that search?
- A Yes.

- Q And they concluded it was a car crash or something?
- A Yes.

A

- Q Who told you that?
 - The Civil Air Patrol...the person in charge, this person in charge by the way changed every couple of days because they are a volunteer organization. Also I was in contact with the FAA person at Logan Airport. I don't know what his title is but the person in charge of the FAA there and he was actually my main contact. He was (inaudible)...stop searching and when I got...(inaudible)...Captain Illinois ...(inaudible) ...air force portion of the search.
- When you called on Noreen and first approached her about your problem on the day before you actually saw her did you give her your brother's name?
- A Yes.
- Q Did you tell her where he lived?
- A Yes.
- Q What other information (inaudible).about where he worked?
- A No. She...I didn't give her any other information. Matter of fact she told me not to give her too much information because she wanted to just see what came out. I might add that I was very skeptical, so I was pretty careful about what I did and didn't tell her.
- You don't have any idea whether she...you don't have any way of knowing whether she made phone calls after she talked to you to find out what the (inaudible)
